Yamamiya Sengen Shrine

A shrine where you can experience the form of ancient Mt Fuji rituals, Although there is no main hall, it is believed to be the former site of Sengen Taisha Shrine. (MAP) P18 B3)

Murayama Sengen Shrine

A shrine that flourished as a base for mountain ascetics, It is surrounded by large cedar trees, and has a solemn atmosphere. (MAP) P18 C4)

From the Fujinomiya Trail 5th Station to the summit of Mt. Fuji!

At 2,400 m, the Fujinomiya Trail 5th Station is the highest of the Mt. Fuji trailheads and offers the shortest route to the summit: roughly 5 km. The ascent requires 4-7 hours, and the descent requires 2-3
